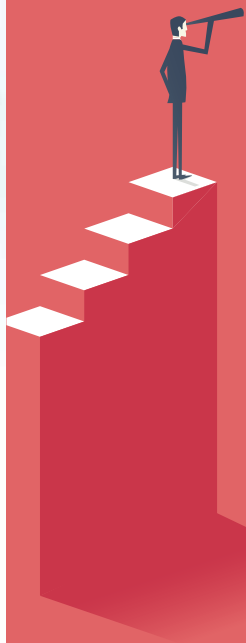

House System

To create an atmosphere of healthy competition and team spirit, most of the school activities are governed by House-system which are divided into four different houses, i.e., Dayanand, Aurobindo, Vivekanand and Shradhanand. Inter House competitions are held regularly.

Educational Tours

The schools plan picnics and educational tours for the students. They are taken to Historical Places, Museums, Factories, Research Institutions etc. to provide them a first-hand knowledge. The outings and interaction with Nature have a soothing effect on their body, mind and soul.

Games & Sports

We don't confine our students to the four walled classrooms only but provide training and practice to excel in the playground and stage activities for the all-round development of personality of the child.

Assembly and Moral Education

To inculcate moral values in the students, the school starts each working day with the morning assembly, that includes recitation of Veda Mantras, devotional songs, patriotic songs and thought for the day. Stress is laid on the universal aspects and eternal values of Indian Culture. Short talks are given by the students and teachers on a variety of subjects and important current events. They are also trained in Yoga, Martial Arts and Music by the experts.

Guidelines for Students

- ▶ The entire students must possess school diary, text books, note books, stationery etc.
- ▶ Students are advised not to bring valuable articles to the school. The school will not be the responsible for any loss.
- ▶ School bus users must strictly observe the rules of the school transport.
- ▶ Application for leave must be submitted one day in advance. It should be counter signed by the parent/ guardian.
- ▶ Students must come in school uniform.
- ▶ They must be neat and clean.
- ▶ Students must obey the House Captains and other students on duty.
- ▶ Students are not allowed to leave the school during working hours unless the parents/guardians whose names are on the admission forms and the school diary come in person.
- ▶ School identity cards must be with the students on all working days.
- ▶ Students should be regular in attendance.
- ▶ Any damage to the school property by the student will have to be borne by the respective parents/guardians.
- ▶ The school reserves the right to take stern action even to strike off the names of the students from the school rolls who are found guilty of misconduct.

ADMISSIONS

Age Eligibility

(As on 1st April of the academic session for which admission is sought) Nursery – 3* years & for LKG onwards – subsequent addition of 1 year.

Documents Required

For Nur. & LKG : A copy of birth certificate from the Municipality, Gram Panchayat or Govt. Hospital.

For UKG & above : T.C. issued by the previous school attended. (Note – TC issued by the Non Recognized schools must be accompanied by the Original birth certificate).

Students who have attended other schools must submit a photocopy of the report card of the last year from the previous school.

Transport Rules

All the students using the School Bus are expected to be on the right side of their bus stops at least five minutes prior to the arrival time of the bus.

The buses will not wait for the last comers.

The children should stay away from the main road until the bus arrives.

No students should come near the entry door of the bus until it has made a complete stop.

The drivers are authorized to stop buses at the designated stops only, unless otherwise directed by the bus-in-charge. The list of stops is prepared keeping in view the convenience and safety of all the riders and is always subject to change.

When the bus is in motion students must not move in the bus. The riders must not have any part of their body out of the bus.

Objects of any kind must not be discarded inside or thrown out of the bus.

Discarding of trash of food either inside or outside the buses is not permitted.

Withdrawal Rules

The T.C./SLC and progress Report shall not be issued until the clearance of all dues.

Those who apply for T.C. after 20th of April shall have to clear the fee dues of the month of April.

Fees once paid are not refundable in case of withdrawal.

Important

Obtaining a form does not guarantee admission.

Shrieking, shouting, or any other kind of unruly behaviour is strictly prohibited. Courteous behaviour is expected all the times.

Students will be held responsible for any deliberate damage caused to the buses.

Indiscipline, misconduct and any breach of instructions in the bus will lead to the withdrawal of bus facility with immediate effect and further necessary action.

Transport Fee Rules

The charges per pupil per month or any part is given in the fee schedule. A schedule of the charges is available at the school office. The school does not entertain any request for change of bus-stops and bus-routes to suit an individual's convenience.

Withdrawal from availing transport facility is not allowed during the session.



Absence

One who remains absent must submit an application duly countersigned by the parents on the day of resuming the classes.

No leave is granted except on Medical grounds.

Repeated absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than 10 working days renders the student liable to have his name struck off the rolls, re-admission may be granted only on payment of a fresh admission fees.

It is compulsory for the students to complete 80% of their attendance in the year to make them eligible to sit for their final examination.

Absence due to sickness must be supported by a medical certificate. The students attending school after suffering from an infectious disease such as measles, chicken pox, cholera, mumps, whooping cough etc. must produce a fitness certificate from a registered doctor.

Please Do

Use the school diary as a means of communication with the class teacher and check the diary for homework and the teacher's remarks, if any.

Sign the test copies/papers as and when sent home.

See that your ward has all the text books, items of stationary, craft materials etc. right in the beginning of the session.

Ensure that all the books and note books are covered with the brown papers.

Ensure that your ward comes to the school in the proper uniform with the polished shoes, trimmed hair and clean nails without any cosmetics/chemicals.

Send the children regularly and punctually to the school. No absence will be permitted without a leave application and late comers will not allowed to sit in the class.

Both the parents must attend the Parent Teacher Meet.

Please Don't

Don't send the child in case of an infectious disease, and a medical certificate should be furnished from a medical authority at the time rejoining school after the illness.

Don't walk in the classroom or meet the teacher in the classroom. Please see the subject teacher in the classroom with the prior appointment of the class-teacher.

Don't visit the teacher at their residence.

Don't send money or any valuable articles with the students. The school takes no responsibility if they are lost.

Don't pay even an amount less than Rs 1/- without a printed receipt.

Don't provide any electronic device i.e. Mobile, Calculator & pager and Motor Bike to your ward.

Fee Collection Rules

Only Online fee is accepted.

- ▶ The fee collection hours are as follows: Monday-Friday 08:00 AM to 12:00 Noon.
- ▶ Last date for acceptance of School fees is 15th of the month without fine.
- ▶ Last fee deposit fine of Rs 50/- will be charged up to end of the month.
- ▶ Fee will not be accepted after 25th of the month.
- ▶ Arrears of the fee of a month must be deposited by the 5th of the next month with a fine of Rs 100/-
- ▶ Names of the defaulter will be struck off the rolls after non payment of the fee for two months without any intimation.
- ▶ Re-admission may be accepted on payment of Rs 500/- as admission fee along with the permission of the Principal.
- ▶ Payment of fees in advance on a quarterly, half-yearly and annual basis is also accepted.
- ▶ For new session, the fees up to the month of June are to be deposited by 20th of April.
